

And she might've just struck gold when she landed the role that she remains in to this day: art director at Tory Burch, where she handles all the photography, social media, and visual strategy for the brand. With Tory Burch's recent transformation from preppy to modern and even edgy with sheer, mesh fabrics and '60s-inspired silhouettes, the rebrand has the likes of Hailey Bieber and Emily Ratajkowski giving their cool girl stamps of approval.
